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## **Barton County Community College's Mission:**

Barton offers exceptional and affordable learning opportunities supporting student, community, and employee needs.

## **Executive Summary**

During the summer of 2022, a cross-functional team of Barton representatives met to review and analyze Barton institutional scholarships allocations and spending. The research was to understand: 1) funding resources available to students; and, 2) how Barton scholarships overlap or intersect with other funding. The objective of the review was to provide recommendations for improvement of the current use of institutional funds.

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## **Methodology**

- Projections of Institutional Scholarship Expenditures versus Scholarship Revenue

## **Recommendations**

These recommendations arose from the review of data and discussion of the Scholarship Review Group.

### **1. Develop Foundation and Other Awards Focused Towards High School Students**

#### **Context:**

The group discussed “reimbursement scholarships” for high school students who eventually matriculate to Barton. A peer institution is providing reimbursement of tuition spent on classes taken during high school after a student graduates from high school and attends full-time their freshman year. The group decided a better action for Barton is to focus on already emerging initiatives such as availability of Foundation scholarships for high school students. Focus on this goal and more targeted recruiting of high school students receiving Barton scholarships may have a more effective outcome.

#### **Rationale:**

A goal of the Foundation is to develop more scholarships for high school students. As well, other resources may be on the horizon for high school students. Exploring and developing these eminent resources seems most reasonable. The process for “reimbursement scholarships” would be very time-consuming and institutionally risky considering the small return on investment.

### **2. Adopt Impartial Institutional Stance on Financial Aid Refunds to Students**

#### **Context:**

While attending college, students have both direct and indirect expenses. Direct expenses such as tuition, fees, and books are those costs paid directly to the college. Indirect expenses include costs such as room and board, transportation, and personal expenses student pay while attending college. Students pay these expenses to enable them to attend school. Therefore, the group decided refunds or overage of financial aid (e.g. grants, scholarships, loans) above the direct expenses to Barton and delivered to students are necessary for students to pay indirect expenses.

#### **Rationale:**

Past discussion of financial aid has included consideration of the amount of overage refunds directly paid to students. Subjective judgment regarding refunds to students could be allowing implicit bias influence the decision-making process. Eliminating the consideration of what a student receives as a refund allows more objective decision-making.

### 3. **Require a Separate Barton Bound Scholarship Application**

#### Context:

Currently, students only complete the Barton Admission Application for considering of the Barton Bound Scholarship. Going forward, students will complete a separate application for the Barton Bound scholarship, decoupling from the Admissions Application. This will begin for the 2023-24 academic year.

#### Rationale:

This change will ensure the Financial Aid Office has all scholarship applications for Barton Bound awarding. In the past, there have been disconnects between completing the Admissions Application and being awarded the Barton Bound Scholarship. Requiring application through Scholarship Universe will also increase efficiency and greater functionality of the Scholarship Universe functionality.

### 4. **Award the Barton Bound Scholarship Based on the Seventh Semester High School GPA**

#### Context:

The Financial Aid Office will award the Barton Bound Scholarship award amount based upon the 7<sup>th</sup> semester (high school) GPA from an unofficial transcript uploaded with the Barton Bound scholarship application. In the past, the Financial Aid Office would award based off the final high school transcript, which is not available until mid-summer.

#### Rationale:

This change allows for awarding scholarships sooner rather than waiting for the official transcript available in the summer. The Foundation would also be aware of students receiving the Barton Bound scholarship when they are awarding Foundation scholarships in June. This change will allow the Financial Aid Office to award the Barton Bound much earlier. Award announcements at senior events would be awards officially offered rather than conditional awards.

**5. Extend the Barton Bound Deadline to August 1**

Context:

Barton will extend the deadline for students to apply for a Barton Bound scholarship from May 1 to August 1 for the fall term. New students entering the spring semester will have a scholarship deadline of January 1.

Rationale:

Students deciding late to attend Barton can still apply for a Barton Bound Scholarship.

**6. Change Barton Bound Scholarship Award Levels and Amounts**

Context:

This table shows the previous award levels and amounts for Barton Bound Scholarships.

Rationale:

For recruiting, the most appealing scholarship to prospective students is a tuition and books scholarship. Lowering the minimum GPA to receive a books and tuition scholarship should attract more students. Eliminating the optional ACT score criteria will simplify the recruiting message and streamline the awarding process.

## 7. Renew the Barton Bound Scholarship for the Same Award Amount

### Context:

Currently, Barton renews the Barton Bound Scholarship for subsequent years based upon the student's cumulative Barton GPA at the end of the spring semester. The recommendation is to keep the award amount consistent through the eligibility of the student to receive this scholarship.

Example: A student awarded a books and tuition scholarship will receive a renewal scholarship for books and tuition regardless of the Barton cumulative GPA.

### Rationale:

If students know the award amount to expect each year they attend Barton, they will be better able to plan financing. This change will also streamline the renewal process and allow greater Scholarship Universe functionality.

## 8. Use Scholarship Universe as the Departmental/Activity Scholarships Application

### Context:

Students would use Scholarship Universe to apply for Departmental and Activity Scholarships. Sponsors would make awards through Scholarship Universe.

### Rationale:

Currently, sponsors award students using spreadsheets to identify scholarships for students. Having applicants and sponsors use Scholarship Universe will centralize scholarship actions. This is also more fully utilizing Scholarship Universe's functionality.

## Conclusion

The Scholarship Review team has concluded review, discussion, and proposed changes based upon data and consideration of best service to students and institutional risk. If Barton's administration approves these recommendations, they would go into effect for academic year 2023-34, Fiscal Year 24. The next step in this process is for formal approval by Barton's President, Dr. Heilman.

#### Current Scholarship Parameters

Competing in the NJCAA, Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference, our athletic teams offer performance-based scholarships to student-athletes in 12 different sports. Scholarship offers and amounts are determined by individual coaches and athletic staff.

Students receiving athletic scholarships are not eligible for additional Barton scholarships, other than qualifying academic scholarships.

#### Processing Mechanism

The Athletic Department enters awards into excel spreadsheets stored on a shared network drive. The Financial Aid Office then enters the awards into Banner financial aid forms. This is a manual process.

#### Peer Institutions

##### Butler County Community College

**ACTIVITY/ATHLETIC SCHOLARSHIPS:** These are provided by various departments to students who wish to participate in activities such as sports, livestock judging, journalism-radio/television, theatre, music, spirit squad, dance team, and the Student Government Association. Scholarship selection and award is determined by the activity sponsor or division.

##### Hutchinson Community College

HCC is a member of the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference and the National Junior College Athletic Association. Please note: Scholarships are determined by individual coaches and athletic staff. In accordance with Kansas Jayhawk Conference regulations, students receiving athletic scholarship must maintain a 3.5 cumulative GPA to be eligible for additional HCC scholarships. Student athletes may receive up to a maximum of \$500.00 per semester of HCC scholarship funds in addition to their athletic scholarships.

**TECHNICAL SCHOLARSHIPS:** These scholarships are provided as an incentive for students who could not or would not otherwise enroll in technical programs at Butler. Awards are available for \$265 for 12 or more hours of enrollment of which 6 or more hours have to be vocational. \$132.50 is available for 6-11 credit hours of enrollment, of which 3 or more have to be vocational hours. The student must provide other costs themselves. Students can receive this scholarship for up to 4 semesters if they meet the following criteria each semester: 1 Students awarded a full scholarship must complete 12 hours with a 2.0 GPA. 2 Part-time students must complete 6 hours with a 2.0 GPA.

## **Kansas Promise Scholarship**

The Kansas Promise Scholarship was created during the 2021 Kansas Legislative Session to assist students attending Kansas community colleges, technical colleges, Washburn Institute of Technology and certain private postsecondary educational institutions and enrolled in specified programs of study, generally in the fields of (1) information technology and security, (2) mental and physical health care, (3) advanced manufacturing and building trades, or (4) early childhood education and development. This scholarship may be used toward tuition, required fees, books and required program materials.

### **Students must meet the following criteria:**

- Be a Kansas Resident AND
- Have graduated from a KS High School within the preceding 12 months or have received a GED or other high school equivalency credential within the preceding 12 months, OR
- Be 21 years of age or older and a KS resident for the preceding three consecutive years, OR
- Be a dependent child of a military service member who is stationed in another state and who, within the preceding 12 months, graduated from an out-of-state high school or obtained a GED or other high school equivalency credential.

### **To apply and remain qualified for the Kansas Promise Scholarship students must:**

- Complete the Kansas Promise Scholarship application; AND
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA); AND
- Enroll in an eligible program of study; AND
- Sign a Kansas Promise Scholarship Agreement that you agree to live and work in Kansas for a minimum of two consecutive years following successful completion of your program; AND
- Successfully complete an eligible program of study within 30 months of first being awarded a Kansas Promise Scholarship.
