Compliance Corner "Tip of the Month"

Article VIII: Grants-In-Aid, Recruitment, and Booster Clubs

Section 2. RECRUITMENT

- A. Recruiting is any solicitation of a prospect or a prospect's relatives (or legal guardians) by an institutional staff member or by a representative of the institution's athletics interests for the purpose of securing the prospect's enrollment and ultimate participation in the institution's intercollegiate athletics program.
- B. No institution shall permit a prospective student-athlete to be solicited to attend such institutions by the promise of gift or any aid or inducement other than that of a Grant-in-Aid permitted by these rules.

ARTICLE VIII, Section 2.A. CASE 1: Recruiting Athletes - Loaning Money

SITUATION:

While recruiting Prospective Student-Athlete R, the coach at Community College A loans him/her a small sum of money for personal needs. Can this be construed as an inducement for Prospective Student-Athlete R to attend Community College A?

ANSWER:

Yes. Any aid other than that of a grant-in-aid which is permitted by Section 1.A is a violation.

DARIN SPENCE: Women's Basketball Head Coach



Darin Spence is in his first season as the Head Coach of the women's basketball program, leading the Lady Cougars to a 10-4 record to start the season. Most notably and more recently, in Barton's last game before the holiday break, the Lady Cougars upset then-ranked #3 Independence 63-61.

Spence is no stranger to the Jayhawk Conference, as well as, Division I level basketball, with over 435 career coaching wins. Spence racked up over 300 wins in women's basketball at Cowley and Butler. Ten times in his eleven years at the respective schools his teams ranked in the nation's top 10 in scoring defense. He has coached 10 NJCAA All-America, 25 All-Region, 5 All-District, and 25 NJCAA Academic All-America selections.

Spence comes to Barton from New Mexico State University where he guided the Aggies for eight seasons. His 109 wins at NMSU places him second on the career win list in the history of the Aggie program. While at NMSU, Spence led the Aggies to the conference tournament championship game for the first time in the program's history and did

so in three consecutive years (2006-08). He also guided them to only their second and third victories over ranked opponents, is one of only five coaches in Aggie history to achieve a 20-win season, and is one of only three coaches in WAC Tournament history to guide his team to three consecutive championship games. Spence also led the NMSU program to a post season appearance for only the fourth time in program history and only the third coach in the program's history to do so.



Originally from Escondido, California, Spence received his undergraduate degree in 1985 from Marymount College in Salina, Kansas, and his master's degree from Emporia State in 1993.

Coach Spence and his wife Andre' have four children, Sierra, Madison, Sacia, and Drake.

CRAIG FLETCHALL: Men's Basketball Head Coach



Craig Fletchall ("Fletch") is in his 7th season and is Barton's 2nd all-time winning coach trailing only Dan McGovern. Entering the 2011-12 campaign with an overall record of 131-59, an average of nearly 22 wins a season, Fletch trails McGovern's 188 wins accumulated in 8 seasons for the top spot. Overall Fletch's career collegiate coaching record is 233-116.

After starting the season unranked and picked to finish seventh in the Conference race, Fletch's Cougars have started the season 14-0 and have climbed to #8 in the nation. Being in the NJCAA Division I poll is not unusual for Fletch's Cougars as they have spent a lot of time ranked in the Top 25 with the highest ranking coming in 2009 when Barton climbed all the way to 7th in the polls. The 2009 team went on to win the Jayhawk West title but lost in the Region VI semifinals. Fletch also has won Jayhawk Conference Coach of the Year awards in 2007 and 2009.

Coach Fletchall has spent most of his career in the Jayhawk Conference and its surrounding communities. He grew up in Hutchinson and went

to college at Wichita State University and Fort Hays State University. He spent 11 seasons in the high school ranks, winning a state title at Hutch Trinity in 1987, and earning league Coach of the Year honors at Trinity (1987) and Shawnee Mission East (1993). Fletch spent 8 years prior to Barton in the conference at Cowley College and Neosho County In his final season at Neosho, Fletch guided Neosho to the Region VI finals for the 1st time in school history and were ranked as high as 12th which was also the highest Neosho's history.



Coach Fletchall and his wife Patty have three children Morgan, who currently attends Barton, Mara, and Melyne.
