

Mike Warren - Head Coach

Mike Warren is in his 28th year as the head baseball coach at Barton. Through 27 seasons, Warren has accumulated an overall record of 861-566. His teams have won five Jayhawk Conference Western Division championships and two Western Sub-Regional championships. This past season Warren surpassed the 800-win mark at Barton and has a career record of 960-676.

Over the past several summers, Warren has seen four of his former pitchers find their way

into Major League Baseball: Steve Edlefsen (San Francisco Giants), Nate Field (breaking in with the Kansas City Royals and this past season with the Florida Marlins), David Sanders (Chicago White Sox), and Jason Stanford (Cleveland Indians) have made it big in the Big Leagues. In addition, three Cougars were selected in the first eight rounds of the 2006 MLB Draft: Chad Lee (pitcher, 4th round, Oakland A's), Jeff Christy (catcher, 6th round, Minnesota Twins), and Nate Hedrick (pitcher, 8th round, New York Mets).



Brent Biggs Assistant Coach

Brent Biggs is in his 4th year with Barton, returning to the school that he started his collegiate career at. Biggs played for the Cougars in 2005 and 2006. He began his coaching career in 2008 in the Northwoods

Biggs was a 1st team all Jayhawk West selection his sophomore year at Barton as a 2nd baseman. That season his hit .300 as well as fielded .958. His freshman season, Biggs was an honorable mention selection to the All West team. Biggs started 105 of 108 games. He played at Fort Havs for two seasons earning Honorable Mention All MIAA his senior season with the Tigers.





Brett McBride Assistant Coach

Brett McBride is another former Barton player on the coaching staff as he begins his second season with the Cougars. He played along side Coach Biggs on the 05 and 06 editions of Barton baseball. McBride went 2-3 on the mound during his 2 seasons, starting 10 times and appearing in 21 games.

From Barton he went to Emporia State where he was part of the Hornets team that finished 2nd in the NCAA Division II his senior season of 2009
