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Workforce Partnership in Education Award

The College is highlighting the value of its workforce partners through the creation of an award that will honor one business or organization every six months. The “Workforce Partnership in Education” award was established with the first award going to local workforce giant CPI Qualified Plan Consultants Inc.

“Those of us in the Workforce Training and Community Education (WTCE) Division could not do our jobs on any given day if it wasn’t for partnerships,” said Dean of Workforce Training and Community Education, Elaine Simmons.

Award recipients are selected by a panel of Barton administrators from nominations submitted by WTCE staff. Criteria for selection cover a wide swath of partnership involvement and/or contributions to programs and industries.

The concept of a partnership award is an idea borrowed from another college, said Barton Executive Director of Institutional Advancement Darnell Holopirek. “When something works well somewhere else, you try it,” she explained. Holopirek added that a common misconception is that supporting Barton only involves financial giving. But there are other ways to establish support with the College, she said.

“In working with Elaine and her group, I’ve realized over the years, it’s not always about money,” said Holopirek. “It’s encouragement and working together for a common goal to see the success of our students. It’s not just one thing that makes you a supporter of Barton Community College. Partnership takes a lot of individuals and a lot of businesses.”

Though Barton’s first award recipient is the area’s largest private employer, future winners won’t necessarily be large businesses, explained Simmons.

“I want folks to understand there are so many ways to be a partner,” she said. ... “CPI is a true engine to the economic success of this area with its organization and the employment of the people and all they contribute to the community and to the institution. At the same time, partnership isn’t always about size. We have small businesses and individuals representing entities across our service area who make a difference.”

Recipients of the semiannual award will be invited to a special luncheon where their award will be presented. They will also attend a special dinner with College and BCC Foundation Board members toward the end of the year.

It all started when Cathy Estes and Cheryl Couch put their heads together. It has ended with a rare opportunity for students who want a career in early education to have more access to academics and hands-on work experience. Marla Canfield, from Kansas Commerce, is the director of the Early Childhood Associate Apprentice Program for Kansas and offered Barton a great opportunity to help students afford their college degree while working in early childhood.

Cathy Estes is service coordinator at Sunflower's Early Education Center (EEC) and Couch is instructor/coordinator of early childhood at Barton Community College. The EEC serves infants and toddlers with developmental delays.

College students can now earn a Child Development Associate certificate for early intervention, age birth to three or for preschoolers, three-five year olds.

“This is a first for us,” Estes said. “It started in January and it is exceeding our high expectations. The program is tailor made for teaching infants and toddlers, thanks to Cheryl Couch, who developed the curriculum.

“Participants are able to work at our center while doing their coursework through the College. The curriculum is designed for learning about home visits and the classroom,” she added. “The College should be commended for its many efforts; it is a great partner for Sunflower.”

In the past, the CDA was only for teaching preschool, ages three and older, but Estes also wanted to pursue the infant/toddler track. Simultaneously, Cheryl Couch saw a need for working students to have access to a scholarship program.

“So, I started investigating and came across a program called ECAAP,” Couch recalled. “It sounded too good to be true, but we have discovered it can be the answer for college students interested in this field.

“It also is rare for a community college to have a relationship with a special-education facility,” Couch added. “And we couldn’t be happier with Sunflower. It is phenomenal.”

Examples of Barton Community College’s quality education can be found throughout Great Bend and all of Central Kansas, but Western Kansas Surgical Specialists (WKSS) stands out as a shining example of BCC education in action.

Registered Nurse Lori Slater of WKSS currently employs four BCC alumni. The most recently hired is Cassie Niedens, who is working as a secretary on an internship for Slater, though the temporary position has opened up a long-term opportunity.

Niedens is currently enrolled in the Medical Coding and Billing program at BCC, but Slater, impressed with Niedens’ capabilities, offered her the position full-time after graduation. “She caught on so well, and I know she’s only going to get better,” Slater said. “Barton allows the business community to get involved in the education process. You can tell that’s been successful because the students I’ve hired have met our needs very well.”

Graduates of BCC’s Medical Assistant program Amber Barnes and Connie Holliday have been employed at WKSS for four and three years, respectively. Registered Nurse Gina Clare, also a BCC graduate, came on board with Slater in 1999.

The recipe for her employees’ success, Slater said, is simple. “Barton hires quality instructors who have actual knowledge of the industry they teach,” she said. “Their work is excellent. The medical assistants that come out of Barton’s program have such a vast knowledge base.”
