Students who meet the university admission requirements and declare Dietetics as a major will begin in a general dietetics program. Approximately three semesters before expected graduation, they will need to apply to the Didactic Program in Dietetics. To be admitted, students must have grade of "B" or better in all Science and Professional courses and must have grade of "C" or better in communication, social sciences, quantitative studies, and humanities. Students will also need to submit an application packet, which includes an application, resume, and summary of dietetics related work or volunteer experience. Admission to the DPD program does not guarantee acceptance into an internship program. According to the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics, nationwide over the last several years only 50% of those who applied to internships/supervised practice programs were accepted.

Your Degree Option

This program meets the academic requirements set forth by the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics and qualifies the student to apply for post-baccalaureate supervised practice programs. The student must obtain supervised practice experience after graduation in order to qualify to take the national examination to become a Registered Dietitian. Students who complete the Dietary Management program could apply to dietary manager positions and work while they are completing the coursework for the B.S. degree in Dietetics. The Dietary Manager Certificate Program is designed for individuals who would like to be employed as a manager in food service at nursing homes, schools, correctional facilities, and hospitals. Students in the program will gain knowledge and experience in food preparation and management, nutrition therapy, and human resource management.

Your Career

Registered Dietitians (RDs) are professionals who translate the science of food and nutrition to enhance the well-being of individuals and groups. Many dietitians work in health care facilities such as hospitals and extended care facilities. Dietitians also may be found working in public health settings, such as Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) programs; food stamp programs; programs for the elderly; or non-commercial and commercial foodservice operations. The broad range of opportunities for practice within dietetics provides RDs with maximum flexibility as they move through their professional careers. With growing public interest in nutrition and wellness, the demand for dietitians continues to exceed supply. Publications from the Bureau of Labor Statistics to popular magazines, such as Cosmopolitan, cite dietetics as a field of opportunity in the coming decade. Dietetics offers the opportunity to combine an interest in food and nutrition with the privilege of meeting the needs of individuals or groups in wellness, illness, and all other stages of the life cycle. RDs are the only health professionals trained specifically in foods and nutrition and thus are viewed as "nutrition experts."

Get Started

This degree map has been reviewed and accepted by both schools as an illustration, which is subject to change.
