- No grade lower than a B in natural science and professional courses.
- No grade lower than a C in all other required dietetics curriculum foundation courses.

Students who meet the university admission requirements and declare Dietetics as a major will begin in a general dietetics program. Upon completion of certain science and professional courses, students will need to apply to the Didactic Program in Dietetics. Students should have some dietetics-related work and/or volunteer experience in order to be competitive for admission. Admission to the DPD program does not guarantee acceptance into an internship program. According to the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics, nationwide over the last several years only 50% of those who applied to internships/supervised practice programs were accepted.

This program meets the academic requirements set forth by the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics and qualifies the student to apply for post-baccalaureate supervised practice programs. The student must obtain supervised practice experience after graduation in order to qualify to take the national examination to become a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist. The pre-dietetics program is for students who have no desire to work as dietary managers but need to complete the general education and pre-requisite courses for the Bachelor of Science degree in Dietetics.

Your Career

Registered Dietitian Nutritionists (RDNs) are professionals who translate the science of food and nutrition to enhance the well-being of individuals and groups. Many dietitians work in health care facilities such as hospitals and extended care facilities. Dietitians also may be found working in public health settings, such as Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) programs; food stamp programs; programs for the elderly; or non-commercial and commercial foodservice operations. The broad range of opportunities for practice within dietetics provides RDNs with maximum flexibility as they move through their professional careers. With growing public interest in nutrition and wellness, the demand for dietitians continues to exceed supply. Publications from the Bureau of Labor Statistics to popular magazines, such as Cosmopolitan, cite dietetics as a field of opportunity in the coming decade. Dietetics offers the opportunity to combine an interest in food and nutrition with the privilege of meeting the needs of individuals or groups in wellness, illness, and all other stages of the life cycle. RDNs are the only health professionals trained specifically in foods and nutrition and thus are viewed as "nutrition experts."

Get Started

The degree map on the reverse page will show you a listing of classes you need to take from Barton Community College and K-State to complete the Didactic Program in Dietetics 2+2. This degree map has been reviewed and accepted by both schools as an illustration, which is subject to change. Many other combinations of courses may be possible, so students should contact a K-State representative or their community college advisor before committing to a particular transfer program.

Note: Kansas Board of Regents requirements have been incorporated into this degree plan, including the following rules governing bachelor's degrees: a. A bachelor's degree must include at least 120 credit hours;

- b. It must have at least 60 credit hours earned from an institution where the majority of degrees granted are at the bachelor's degree level or higher;
- c. It must include at least 45 credit hours at the junior level (numbered 300) or higher;
- d. Each student must successfully complete credit-bearing courses/experiences to cover all of the K-State 8 areas.

Kansas State University will accept up to one-half of the required credit hours from the community college toward the bachelor's degree.
