Barton Refund/Withdrawal Information
The last day to drop a Fall 2015 class for a refund is Friday, August 28th, 2015.
 Students are responsible for communicating that they would like to drop a class and completing a Course Drop Form before this deadline. Depending on the form of payment used during enrollment in the class, there are various methods for how a refund will be returned. If a credit or debit card is used, the payment will be electronically returned to the card. Other methods of payment will be returned via a check sent to the address listed on the student enrollment form.

1. *PRE-REQUISITE INFORMATION

- **College Algebra:** ACT Math Score of at least 23, Accuplacer Math score of at least 45, Intermediate Algebra ASSET score of at least 41.

2. ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

August 11th from 4:00 pm - 7:00 pm. Students planning to travel to campus for automotive classes will also enroll at this time.

- Students will need to know their Social Security Number or Barton ID to complete enrollment forms.
- Students are responsible for their own textbooks for college credit classes. Barton representatives will provide textbook information during enrollment.

Final day to enroll/pay for classes is September 4th.


3. PAYMENT INFORMATION

- Pay in-person at enrollment via **Cash, Check, Credit Card, or Money Order.**

- Pay online via Credit Card or NBS Payment Plan.



Here's how to pay ONLINE:

- Notify the Barton representative at enrollment of how you plan to pay the tuition and fees for your class(es).
- Visit www.bartonccc.edu.
- Mouse over **My Barton** button in the top right-hand corner of the homepage. Click PAWS. 
- Enter Barton ID number and PIN. Use Lookup ID if you don't know your Barton ID. Read the directions for PIN.
- To pay in full, select **Pay Online** and choose the Fall 2014 semester.
- To sign up for the payment plan, select **NBS Payment Plan** and follow the prompts to set it up.
- Automatic bank payment (ACH)
- There is a \$30 per semester non-refundable fee for participating in the payment plan.
- Credit/Debit card payments will be processed on the 5th of each month until the balance is paid in full.

NEW BUSINESS OFFICE POLICY
Students will be enrolled regardless of payment or non-payment and will not be dropped. The amount owed is the student's responsibility and the balance will remain on the student's account as a "hold" until payment is remitted.

BOOST SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION
Students on free and/or reduced lunches are eligible for the Boost. For qualifying students, Boost will cover up to six hours of tuition and fees for face-to-face coursework per semester during an academic year (Fall, Spring, & Summer). Students will be held responsible for charges above six credit hours. Boost does not apply to program fees associated with Senate Bill 155. (Hybrid course fees are not covered.)
