

Barton Financial Aid Facts --

- The average financial aid package offered to Barton students for 16-17 was \$6,414, which was a combination of federal, state, institutional and other aid.
- The largest financial aid award paid to a Barton student in 16-17 was \$20,311.
- 100% of Barton county 2016 high school graduates received some type of financial aid in 2016-17.
- 71% of the Federal Aid applicants (FAFSA) processed for 16-17 were eligible for a Federal Pell Grant. 39% of the applicants were eligible for the maximum Pell of \$5,815.
- 21% of students taking at least one BartOnline class received financial aid, VA or Tuition Assistance (or a combination).
