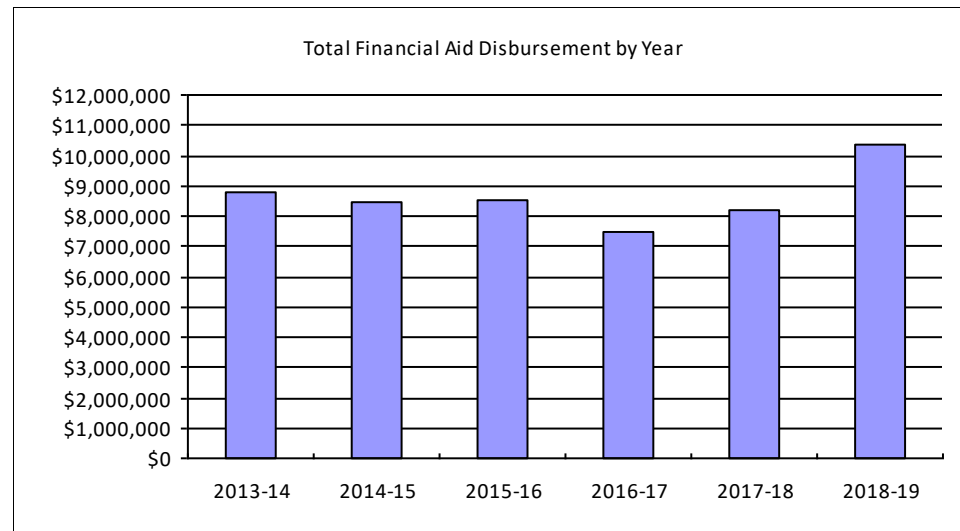

Barton Financial Aid Facts --

- The average financial aid package offered to Barton students for 18-19 was \$7,554, which was a combination of federal, state, institutional and other aid.
- The largest financial aid award paid to a Barton student in 18-19 was \$21,954.
- 71% of the Federal Aid applicants (FAFSA) processed for 18-19 were eligible for a Federal Pell Grant. 64% of the applicants were eligible for the maximum Pell of \$6,095.
