

Certified Safety & Health Official (CSHO) General Industry Certificate Application A Executive Overview

Developed at the request of industry, this certificate provides coursework necessary for employment in the safety field. The courses in this certificate are recommended by members of Midwest OSHA Education Centers and transferable within OSHA Region VII.

Rational

This certificate is designed for personnel who perform safety and health work on a daily basis in general industry environments or have safety responsibilities over others at those locations, including inspections and audits. One of the forces that are the driving change is an increase in lost time from work related injuries. While the demand for quality trained personnel is on the rise, protecting the human resources that are currently employed has never been more important. Trained CSHO personnel help meet the goal of safety in the work place by enforcing safety standards and being proactive in their company's safety program. This certificate answers the business industry's need for trained/ skilled employees who can enter the workforce while still continuing their training after employment.
