> > You as donors continue to allow our non-profit organization the opportunity to assist students in scholarships, program en-



2011-12 Foundation Audit Results



Each year in September the Foundation has an independent, certified audit performed to ensure we are good stewards of the funds we manage and follow all of the regulations to be in full compliance with the Internal Revenue Service. It is very important to operate in compliance with all rules and regulations of the IRS along with the ethical expectations of a well-run non-profit organization. The audit also includes the operations and collections of the Shafer Art Gallery and the Cohen Kansas History Center, which are owned by the Barton Foundation. As with all other government regulated entities, things change each year and we work diligently to

comply with all of the new policies and procedures required. The firm of Adams, Brown, Beran, & Ball CPA examined on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The auditors also include assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. Barton Community College Foundation is proud to report we received an unqualified audit report, which is the highest standard available in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America.



Mini Grants - Gifts to the Barton Faculty

Each fall the Foundation Board of Directors determines where the proceeds of the annual Foundation Sporting Clay Shoot should be used, and for the past six years they have chosen to give mini-grants to Barton's faculty. The funds must be used by the faculty member to enhance their classroom learning experience for their students. Each faculty member has a departmental budget, but many times they have need for equipment or supplies which could be of real benefit as they teach their programs but there are no available funds. The mini-grants give them an opportunity to purchase such necessities which creates good opportunities to enrich their classroom instruction.

To better the lives of others is one of life's greatest rewards, which augment the whole concept of our Barton Foundation; so as we assist the faculty in their pursuit to educate our students we too are developing our student's ability to learn.

The faculty members must complete an application and a committee (volunteers from the Foundation board) then selects which request is

supported and amount that is awarded.

This year we were able to award eight minigrants for a total of \$7,881.69 and the requests ranged from instructional DVD's to a vari-

ety of classroom equipment and supplies.

Below is the verbiage which verifies the extended tax incentives:

The American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012, which was passed by Congress on January 1st this year, extends provisions for IRA charitable rollovers for 2013. This

allows people age 70½ and older to make direct gifts from an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to a qualified charity like Barton Community College Foundation---tax free. The gift would qualify towards your minimum IRA distribution requirement, and you could choose to give any amount up to \$100,000 this year.

To enjoy these tax benefits for 2013, you MUST complete this year's transfer prior to December 31st. Check with your tax advisor about the best ways to take advantage of this giving opportunity and how state and federal tax laws may affect your plans.
