WHAT'S COOKING?



CUSTARD for two

- 1 egg
- 1 C milk
- 3 T sugar
- 3/4 t vanilla extract
- 1/8 t salt
- 1/8 t ground nutmeg

Directions:

In a bowl, lightly beat the egg. Stir in the milk, sugar, vanilla and salt until combined. Pour into two ungreased 6-oz. custard cups. Sprinkle with nutmeg. Place in an 8-in. square baking dish; add 1-in. of hot water to the pan. Bake at 350° for 35 minutes or until a knife comes out clean. Yield: 2 servings.



BREAD PUDDING for two

- 1 1/2 C day-old buttered bread cubes
(2 slices)
- 2 eggs
- 1 C milk
- 1/4 C sugar
- 1/4 t ground cinnamon
- 1/4 t ground nutmeg
- Dash salt

Directions:

Divide bread between two greased 8-oz. baking dishes; set aside. In a bowl, beat eggs, milk, sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg and salt. Pour over bread. Bake, uncovered, at 350° for 40-45 minutes or until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool slightly. Serve warm. Yield: 2 servings.
