
## CHRISTMAS BELLES

# WHAT'S COOKING?

## Panera Bread Potato Soup



### Ingredients:

- 4 cups chicken broth
- 4 cups peeled and cubed potatoes
- 8 oz. cream cheese
- 2 cloves of garlic
- ½ teaspoon seasoning salt
- ½ teaspoon of paprika
- ¼ teaspoon white pepper
- ¼ teaspoon ground red pepper optional, but great if you like more spicy!

### Directions:

1. Combine broth, potatoes, garlic, and spices.
2. Boil on medium heat until potatoes are tender.
3. Smash a few of the potatoes to release their starch for thickening.
4. Reduce to low heat.
5. Add cream cheese.
6. Heat, stirring frequently, until cheese melts.

*Great served in a bread bowl!*

## Crusty Bread

(bread bowl recipe)

### Ingredients:

- 3 cups unbleached all purpose flour
- 1 ¾ teaspoons salt
- ½ teaspoon yeast
- 1 ½ cups water

### Directions:


In a large mixing bowl, whisk together flour, salt and yeast. Add water and mix until a shaggy mixture forms. Cover bowl with plastic wrap and set aside for 12 - 18 hours. Overnight works great. Heat oven to 450 degrees. When the oven has reached 450 degrees place a cast iron pot with a lid in the oven and heat the pot for 30 minutes. Meanwhile, pour dough onto a heavily floured surface and shape into a ball. Cover with plastic wrap and let set while the pot is heating. Remove hot pot from the oven and drop in the dough. Cover and return to oven for 30 minutes. After 30 minutes remove the lid and bake an additional 15 minutes. Remove bread from oven and place on a cooling rack to cool.



**SCC BILLING FOR CLASSES**

It has come to our attention that many of you are receiving payment reminders from the Business Office for the classes you are taking at Barton, whether they are at our downtown facility or on campus.
