For all of you that like to take Aqua Aerobics classes, I have great news. The pool



## THE GREAT WAR OF 1914 TO THE DEPRESSION

It was called the Great War of 1914. The United States stayed out of the conflict until 1917. The decision to declare war on Germany was especially troubling for Kansans with ties to Germany and German Russian communities in Russia. However, when duty called, Kansans answered on the battle-

field, farm, and factories. Soldiers returning home found a very different Kansas as the trauma of war impacted the society. The 1920s were often called the "Roaring Twenties" for good reason. The party ended in 1929 with a combination of depression and drought. This class will explore three decades of change. This class will meet each Tuesday; September 3 – November 5, 2013 from 1:30 – 3:30 p.m. in the Seminar Room (F-30) of the Fine Arts building. 
#### **KANSAS QUIZ BOWL**





# WHAT'S COOKING?



#### ORANGE SALAD

- 1 Small package of vanilla tapioca pudding
- 1-3 ounce package orange Jell-O
- 1-3 ounce package vanilla instant pudding
- 2 C hot water
- 2 C of Cool Whip
- 1 Small can of mandarin oranges, drained

#### **Directions:**

Combine puddings and gelatin in hot water. Cook until thick, stirring constantly. Let cool completely. Fold in Cool Whip and drained oranges. Chill until set.

Serves about 6 people.



### BARBECUE RIBS (or other meats)

- 1/2 C minced onion
- 3 T brown sugar (packed)
- 3 T vinegar
- 3 T Worcestershire sauce
- 1 C catsup
- 1/4 C lemon juice

#### **Directions:**

Glaze onion in margarine. Add brown sugar, vinegar, Worcestershire sauce, catsup, lemon juice. Bake ribs at 350°. Baste ribs during last 45 minutes of baking.




## APPLE NUT CHEESE BISCUITS

- 1/3 C sugar
- 1/3 C chopped walnuts
- 1/2 C shredded cheese
- ½ t ground cinnamon
- 1 ¾ C Bisquick
- 1 small apple peeled, cored and chopped
- 1/3 C cold water
- 1/4 C butter

#### **Directions:**

Combine sugar, nuts & cinnamon – set aside. Stir together Bisquick, cheese, apple. Make a well in the center of mixture and add water all at once. Stir mixture until just moist. Form into balls (about 18) Roll balls in melted butter and sugar mixture. Arrange in a greased 9 inch pan and bake at 400° for 25 – 30 minutes.
