TRANSFER OPTIONS

Transfer from Barton to earn Kansas State University's Bachelor of Science in Dietetics as well as other University programs. A credential from Barton allows students to pursue a bachelor's degree while working in the field.

Barton has partnered with Kansas State University to offer a 2+2 transfer agreement. Barton's program provides:

- » Coursework in general education and life sciences to earn an associate degree and provide a foundation for the bachelor's degree.
- » Seamless transfer agreement to ensure that students are taking the correct courses for transfer.
- » All courses offered online.
- » Academic advising for students at both Barton and K-State.

DEGREE OPTIONS

Associate in Science with an Emphasis in Dietary Management

This emphasis includes dietary manager courses so you can obtain your CDM, CFPP credential first and then transfer to a Bachelor's program, including a dietetics program to become a Registered Dietitian.

Associate in Science with an Emphasis in Pre-Dietetics

This emphasis is the most direct route to becoming a Registered Dietitian as the program is set up for transfer to a Bachelor of Science program in Dietetics.

Partnership with Kansas State University: Satisfies the first two years of the Bachelor of Science in Dietetics offered by Kansas State University.

Associate in Science with an Emphasis in Nutrition and Health

Satisfies the first two years of the Bachelor of Science in Nutrition and Health offered by Kansas State University.

Note: this bachelor degree does not meet the academic requirements needed to become a Registered Dietitian but can still lead to opportunities in public health and wellness.
