tor, Fort Riley campus


- Brian Koch, associate math instructor, Fort Riley campus

The Distinguished Instructor Award for full-time faculty was created in 1984 to recognize teaching excellence. Nominees are recommended by their peers


and then evaluated by a committee, including BCC students, a previous Distinguished Instructor Award recipient, members of the BCC Foundation, board of trustees and community members.
