Applications will be accepted October of 2013 thru December 2013. The application can be accessed on-line at the City of Lincoln website: <a href="www.lincoln.ne.gov">www.lincoln.ne.gov</a>. Click on Lincoln/Lancaster County Employment. Then, scroll down to police trainee and follow the directions.

While completing your application, you will be asked to select a testing date. Both the written and physical portions of the testing will be conducted the same day. The written portion of the test will occur in the morning, beginning promptly at 8:30. You may request a study guide for the written portion of the exam approximately two weeks before the testing date. This is a very important part of the hiring process. If you do not score high enough on the written exam you will not be eligible for the physical exam.

You can see what the physical test entails at: <a href="www.joinlpd.com">www.joinlpd.com</a>. You will need to be physically prepared in order to perform these tests, so plan ahead. If you don't already exercise, now is the time to start a progressive training program so you can be physically prepared to complete all of the required tests. The physical testing includes a 1.5 mile run, vertical jump, sit ups, push ups, and a 120 yard shuttle run.
