Transfer Programs are designed to position you for a successful transfer to a four year college in order to complete a Bachelor's degree.

The earlier you identify your transfer institution, the easier it will be to align your Barton program of study to fit the transfer institution's requirements.

Barton has many Transfer & Articulation Agreements with four year colleges that specifically direct your studies in certain programs for seamless transition from Barton to the transfer school. If none of our Transfer & Articulation Agreements match your educational goals, the Kansas Public Colleges and Universities [Transfer Agreement and Articulation Guide](#) will help you to meet the requirements necessary to graduate from Barton and transfer successfully to the public universities in Kansas.

If you plan to transfer outside the state of Kansas, it will be very helpful to identify your transfer institution early and work with that school's guidelines in order to ensure a smooth transfer. ## Barton Advisors (Spring 2016)

- Barton has 56 advisors that have received training and have been assigned advising duties
- Currently Barton has 5 advisors in training
- Advisors currently assigned to serve 2,756 +/- enrolled Degree/Certificate seeking students as well as intermittent or point in time advisement to Non Degree Seeking students and incoming
- Academic Advisors = 13
- WTCE advisors = 27
- Advisement center/staff advisors = 16
- Fort Riley advisors = 5
- Advisors are transitioning to utilize Degree Works audit as part of graduation application process/replacing manual degree audit process.
- Process in place to assign advisors from application – significantly decreased the time it takes for a new/incoming student to be assigned an advisor.
- We have begun working on a dual advising project with K-State. Jennifer Pfortmiller (K-State employee) is leading this project.

Note: This is a point in time snapshot, the number of advisees is constantly changing due to fluctuations in enrollment. The number of advisors is affected by the following factors: loss or absence of advisor due to illness, etc.; increased advising responsibilities with expanding federal financial aid requirements and increased number of advisees.


## Student Satisfaction ('14-'15 AY)

- Of the 830 students that graduated, approximately 41% (347) completed the survey
- The majority of responses are in the high 70 to high 80 percentages.
- The 41% low response (highlighted) refers to only 47% of the completers (see subsequent “Didn’t use service” at 53%) – this is likely due to limitations surrounding placement
- Slightly more than half of the completers did not plan to transfer
