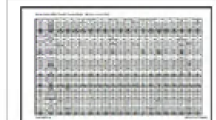
TRANSFER & ARTICULATION

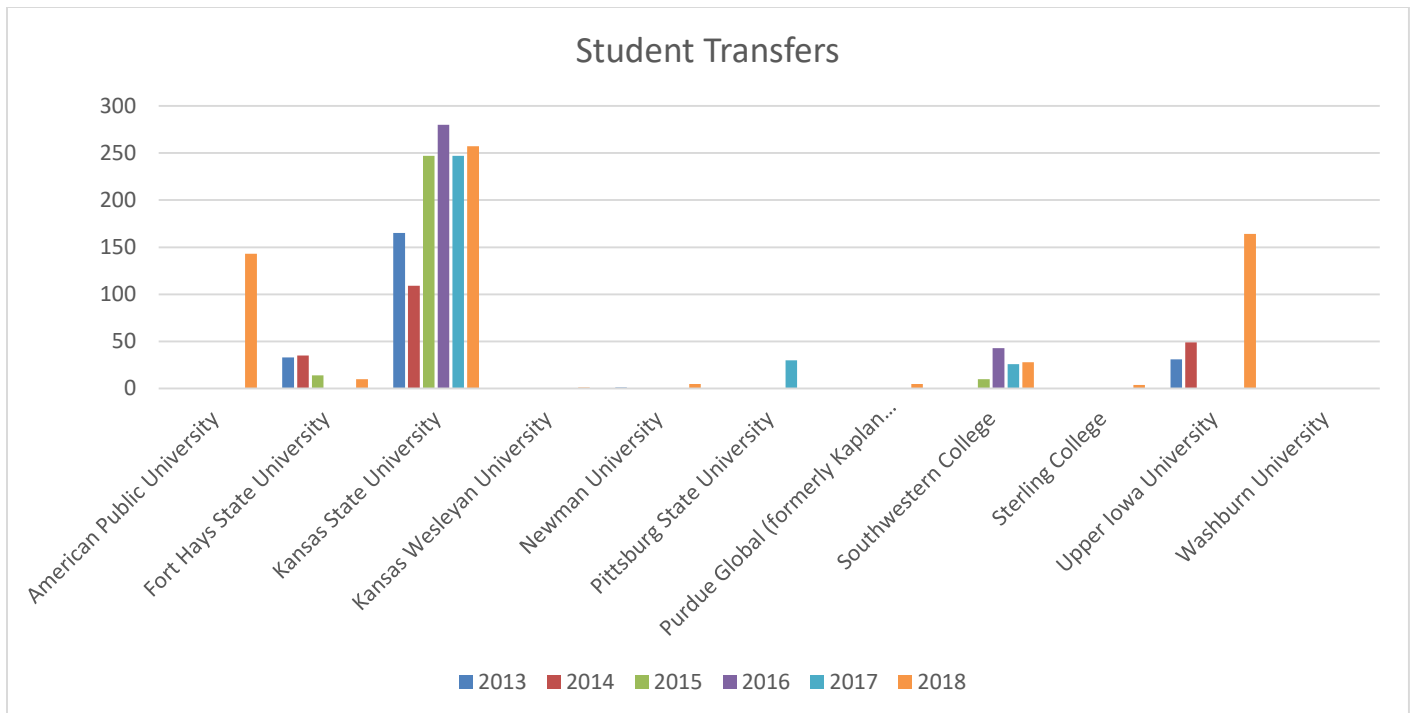
Student Transfer (Data '17-'18 AY)
