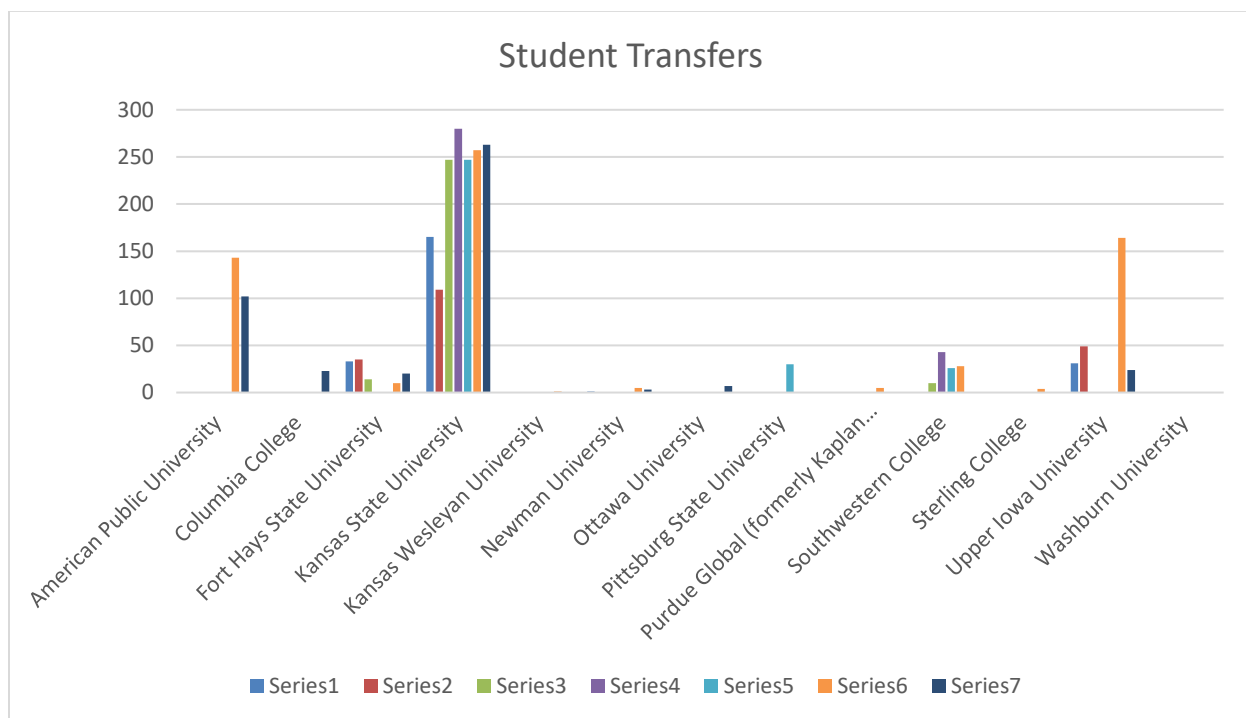
Student Transfer (Data '18-'19 AY)

- Approximately 442 students pursued transfer, utilizing various means including Barton’s 2+2 agreements (as per University report to Barton)



- Between degree or certificate seeking students who are intending to transfer, non-degree or certificate seeking students who are intending to transfer, and transient/guest students, it is estimated that about 75% of Barton students have some transfer intentions or goals.
- Two projects still in the fairly early stages of development are KSU's Direct Link and FHSU's Transfer Connect - seamless transfer programs that provide dual advising to community college students who have identified either KSU or FHSU as their transfer institution at Barton admission.
 - For fall 2019 and spring 2020 admits, Barton has provided 245 prospective student names to FHSU as part of the Transfer Connect project.
