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This bill requires a majority vote of the governing body of a community college (and other "municipalities" to increase property taxes. The bill requires the governing body to lower the amount of ad valorem tax to be levied to the next preceding year's level when the total tangible property valuation increases from the next preceding year due to increases in assessed valuation of existing tangible property.

The bill appears to allow for "new revenue sources" such as new improvements to real property, increased personal property valuation (other than oil and gas leases and mobile homes), property located within added jurisdictional territory, or property which has changed use to not be accounted for in any increase from the next preceding year.

If the governing body votes to increase the tax rate above the rate proscribed by this statute, they must publish such decision in the county where the taxing subdivision is located.
