Overview 2016

- Kick off of the AAS in Occupational Safety and Health (not OSHA)
 (only 2 year program in state of Kansas)
 - Complements OSHA program
 - Meets transitioning soldiers requests
 - Meets industry requests
 - ► Online (spring 2017) and resident
- Provide credentialing straining to transitioning soldiers, family members and Veterans
 - NIEHS (5 year) grant to National PETE with contract to Barton to conduct training across Midwest.
 - Partnership with National PETE (FY 16 conducted 6 classes for \$177,669)
 - Grant is for \$288,000 per grant year.

Overview 2016

- OSHA program
 - Added OSHA CERTS to Military Schools
 - Included OSHA classes in NPETE grant
 - Partner with KDOL
 - First Time in 15 Year History of Midwest OSHA -met OSHA mandated enrollment goals
 - ▶ 100% increase over last year
- Expand Military On Site Training offerings
 - Fort Sill add-on contract classes
 - Market at other posts (Mississippi National Guard)
 - Develop addition training (Unit Movement)

- Hazmat services -
 - ► 652 students (Doesn't include degree students)
 - ► Over 11 years with KDHE contract
- OSHA
 - Growing faster than expected

- Other opportunities thru NPETE
 - ▶ Disaster Site (Florida) \$7400
 - Disaster Response Training (National Level Disaster -on call)
 - ▶ DOT T-T-T -2016 -\$40K
 - ► Future takeover of CCCHST NIEHS 5 year Grant (1-2 M per year)
