New this year is the **Golden Ticket Drawing**. Attendees will have the



### PLEDGE

Pledges allow you to make a larger gift over a longer time period, up to five years. Pledges are a promise to pay over time and we work with you to determine the payment schedule and method that best meets your needs. This is the most flexible way to set up a gift.

### CASH

Gifts of cash, via check, card, ACH withdrawal, or wire transfer are tax-deductible in the year they are made. IRA charitable rollovers are another great tax-efficient way to give if you are 70 ½ years of age or older.

*Tax credits may be available for cash gifts!*

### STOCK

Gifts of stock or other securities may be more tax-advantageous than giving cash, especially to avoid capital gains taxes. The transfer is made through your broker and is easy to do.

### IN-KIND

In-kind gifts of real estate, equipment, professional services, and other property may be an option. Gifts of grain, livestock, and other commodities are great ways to donate to this campaign!
